

Guidance in light of Covid-19

The following is intended to enable social distancing and hygiene to be maintained at our meetings. It falls in line with the latest government and church guidance.

Please do not join us physically if...

- You or someone in your household has Covid-19 symptoms i.e. a new continuous cough, a high temperature, or a loss of / change in sense of taste / smell.
- The Government has advised you to quarantine due to foreign travel or track and trace.

To bring with you

- A face covering.
- You may like to bring your own pen and tissues.

As you arrive

- While current restrictions' do not prohibit our meeting, please do not mingle with those outside your household, other than team workers who are exempt.
- Please also remain mindful of the Government guidelines for social distancing: Please keep the entrance way clear, making use of all available space. If necessary, please form a distanced queue when entering, or if waiting e.g. for the toilets.
- Hand sanitizer and handwashing facilities will be available.
- If refreshments are available, please do not touch any communal jugs etc but rather wait to be served by a team member.

The meeting

- Handouts will include the Bible passage - please take away or discard these yourself.
- If any items are available for use (e.g. pens, Bibles), they will be quarantined before and after each meeting for at least 48 hours.
- Discussion after the talk remains part of our formal meeting - with team members or with small formal support groups - but please head off promptly by 2pm.

If you are 'clinically vulnerable' or would like to maintain more distance

- Please be in touch as we would love to try and accommodate you e.g. with seating further apart. However, please be advised of the risks of attending.
- We continue to have talks available to watch online for those not joining physically.

If someone starts displaying Covid-19 symptoms during the meeting

- They must go home immediately without touching anyone / anything.
- Others who came into contact with them should wash their hands thoroughly, but are not required to leave unless they also develop symptoms or are told to quarantine by the Government.
